TOWN BOARD ACTIONS

The Septembert meeting was called to order at 7:00pm by Chairman Jeff Blix - 9 individuals joined the board in the Pledge of Allegiance. Minutes were approved with two corrections. The correspondence was reviewed and bills paid in the amount of \$67.184.51 Reports were made by the various department heads.

The clerk reported a call about something looking for a plot in the Gnesen Cemetery but left no number and one looking for particulars on the park sign which she referred to Clay Cich.

The treasurer gave his monthly reconciliation. Total funds available as of August 10 is 503.066.33 which included the \$80,000 in CD. the township holds.

The Road Foreman reported the Hunter Lake Rd project is almost done. The strom actually helped with a lot of the clearing for the project, although it took extra time to clear the debris. They are working on grading the roads. Bear Island Road has washouts which need to be addressed before they start eroding the blacktop. It was suggested that we could build them up and then plant rye grass to help with the erosion problem. A change in the slope for the water run off it also needed.

Fire Department had an active month responding to 9 medical calls - 1 a mutual aid - and 6 fire calls - 2 were mutual aid. They participated in NNO and stood by for the Fitger's Triathlon. Members trained in medi-

cation administration protocols, incident action plans and remote area access familiarization. Our department is now able to administer life-saving medications when the situation warrants it. Within 3 hours of purchasing the drugs and putting them into service, they were used to save a life. The department would also like to remind residents to check on the visibility of your fire number from the road. Clear branches or brush that might be covering them to ensure a fast response time. Law Enforcement—nothing Cemetery - nothing

Parks & Rec - the signs are up at the sledding hill. It was thought that placing rocks would be cost prohibitive, but perhaps we could do something with cables or snow fencing to block of the area. Ther will be a pickleball clinic held later in the month.

Community Center - Clay and Walter are working on redoing the sign out front. We still need the contact for the electrical work

Recycling Center - new hauler has been contracted with by WLSSD and the new bins/ dumpsters were delivered this week.

Other Meetings - Clerk attended the DAT meeting where storm clean-up was the hot topic.

Under Old Business: - Fredenberg Lake Road - we will pursue a couple of avenues to try and come up with an equitable way of assessing the residents. We want this to be in place so we can address the project again in the Spring.

Under New Business: Skating Rink - there are boards that need replacing, but we are probably good for another year. We will contact hockey/rink associations to see if they are getting rid of their materials and maybe we can reuse them. Mark will update the rink attendant position.

With no further business, we adjourned at 7:59pm.





ABSENTEE VOTING FOR ELECTIONS

If you plan on voting absentee in the November election - please remember: absentee ballots go through the county. All absentee ballots will be looked at for acceptance by a special county board.

It is still a 2-step process where the voter fills out a request for a ballot. These forms can be requested from either the town or county clerk or be downloaded directly from the Secretary of State website at www.sos.state.mn.us - click on elections and voting. There is no longer a requirement for a reason to vote absentee - anyone can request do so.

. The applications for a ballot will then be sent directly to the County Auditor who will ensure a ballot is mailed to you. You need to be aware that all ballot envelopes will need to go through the board prior to being counted and there are legal deadlines to be met, so don't delay in getting it back to the county if you want your vote to count. Applications for ballots can be sent in anytime and applications for permanent absentee ballots can also be made.

Ballots will be available soon if they aren't already back from the printersbut the application must be on file prior to them being sent out. Don't delay! The next board meeting will be
