LOCAL ST. LOUIS COUNTY INFORMATION ON COVID VACCINE

Each year wildfire burns millions of acres of land. Wildfire safety

- Create a safety zone of up to 100 feet around your home. Remove pine needles and dry leaves from around your home. Keep woodpiles at least 30 feet from your home.
- Know your community's local evacuation plan. Plan ahead by practicing two ways out of your neighborhood. You should know the evacuation route and plan a place where you will go.
- If you are told to evacuate, do so immediately. If you wait until the last minute, the roads may have heavy traffic. Blowing embers and debris from the fire may make it hard to see.
- Stay informed. Listen to the TV/radio broadcasts for current weather and emergency instructions. Sign up to receive local emergency alerts and warnings on both your home phone and cellphone.
- Make sure everyone in your family knows your meeting place ahead of time. Let your family and friends who do not live in your area know your meeting place.

Keep your car fueled and keep an emergency supply bag in your car. Back your car into the garage or park it in an open space facing the direction of escape.

Outdoor fire safety

- Move the grill away from siding, decking, and other things that can catch fire.
- Stay with the grill the entire time you're cooking.
- Use long-handled barbecue tools when cooking on the grill.
- Use a metal screen over wood-burning fires to keep sparks from floating out.
- Turn off or put out fires before you leave the backyard.
- Build campfires at least 15 feet away from tent walls, shrubs or other things that burn.

FREDENBERG TOWNSHIP ST. LOUIS COUNTY, MINNESOTA RESOLUTION NO. 2021-003

RESOLUTION REPEALING THE TEMPORARY MORATORIUM ON GRAVEL PITS, BORROW PITS AND CRUSHING OR BATCH PLANTS WITHIN FREDENBERG TOWNSHIP

WHEREAS, the board of supervisors ("Town Board") of Fredenberg Township ("Town"), at a meeting held on April 1, 2020, adopted "An Ordinance Declaring a Temporary Moratorium on Gravel Pits, Borrow Pits and Crushing or Batch Plants within Fredenberg Township - Ordinance No. 2020-01" imposing a moratorium on gravel pits, borrow pits, and crushing or batch plants ("Interim Ordinance");

WHEREAS, the Interim Ordinance was amended on October 21, 2020 ("Amended Interim Ordinance") in the public interest to extend the period of the moratorium imposed by the Interim Ordinance to April 1, 2021, to make some clarifying edits, and to provide for the establishment of a study committee ("Study Committee") to further protect the planning process and the health, safety and welfare of its citizens;

WHEREAS, the Amended Interim Ordinance took effect on the first date of publication and remains in effect until April 1, 2021 or the effective date of zoning regulations relating to extractive uses unless expressly repealed earlier by Town Board resolution;

WHEREAS, the Study Committee completed its study as outlined in the Amended Interim Ordinance and presented its report to the Town Board on February 3, 2021;

WHEREAS, the Town Board considered the Study Committee's report and took action authorizing the Town Attorney to prepare a resolution repealing the Amended Interim Ordinance;

WHEREAS, the Town Board determines that it no longer desires to maintain the moratorium and regulations imposed under the Amended Interim Ordinance;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board does hereby expressly repeal the Amended Interim Ordinance effective March 17, 2021.

Home fire safety doesn't stop at the door. There are many fire risks outside the home. You may have these in your backyard. Here are some ways you can keep your home safer from outside fire.

Grilling

Make safe outdoor cooking a priority.

- Move the grill away from siding, decking, and other things that can catch fire.
- Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the grill when it's hot.
- Stay with the grill the entire time you're cooking.
- Keep your grill clean so leftover grease and fat won't catch on fire.



Summer months mean grilling! Make sure your home is protected.

Keep grills 3 feet away from your house and anything that can burn.



Warning: Fireworks are dangerous to people and pets. Using them puts your property at risk.

The best way to stay safe from fireworks is to not use them. Instead, attend a public fireworks display put on by professionals.

Backyard Fire Pits

Permanent and portable fire pits bring fire danger to your home. You can prevent fire or burn injury with these simple steps:

- Make sure the fire pit is at least three feet away from your house and anything that can burn.
- Closely watch children when the fire pit is in use.
- Use a metal screen over wood-burning fires to keep sparks from floating out.
- Turn off or put out fires before you leave the backyard.
- Store matches and lighters out of children's sight and reach.

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
